

Boosting the Quality of Education in Uganda

IDB financed the Construction of Student Hostels at Islamic University in Uganda Project in Uganda. The project outputs included: Male student hostel (for 550 students), female student hostel (for 550 students), students dining hall and kitchen for both males and females. Besides, furniture for hostels, generator, 96 cubic meters water tank, kitchen utensils were procured. As a result, at the Mbale (Main) Campus, 4,024 students study. 987 females and 1,520 males reside in campus. In the male hostel, built within the project, 700 students reside, while in the female hostel 600 students reside, both more than the achieved capacity (550). 8,709 students from 23 countries study at the university. As the project positively affected the image of the campus on international students and their parents, the university attracted students from more countries. The accommodation facilities improved the learning environment. The project has brought both regional and international reputation to the university. The number of graduates with honor degree was 313 in 2004, while it is 1,420 in 2012. Since its establishment, 11,268 students graduated from the university. They have been employed in the public and private sectors. In line with the establishment of the IDB-funded campuses, many small businesses have been established around the campuses.
